

DEACONS REACHING OUT DURING THE PANDEMIC

During this long Pandemic your 24 member Deacons have been busy, focusing on the spiritual and physical support of you, our fellow members. Here are some areas that we have been working on:

Home meals: Delivering foods (such as soup, pot pies, and lasagna) to members homebound due to Covid-19, surgery or loss of a loved one

Caregiving outreach: Making calls, emails, and visits to members, offering encouragement and checking if they need assistance (such as grocery delivery or a ride home from hospital)

Greeting Cards: Sending cards of sympathy, thank you, get well/thinking of you, birth of a baby, and baptism to affected members

Masks: Sewing masks and making them available to all members

Prayer Shawls: Knitting them for members who need comfort during a difficult time

Halloween outreach: Assembling Care baskets and mailing them to our college students

Post card message: Sending a card to all members – that we love them and are uplifting them in our prayers

PRESBYTERIAN MEN

One of the ways that PCOC supports at-risk youth in our community is through Omaha Street School. On the second Thursday of each month, PCOC sends a team to prepare and serve lunch to students and staff. On November 12, the masked-up PCOC crew included Karen Morey, Bill Ritchie, Tina Morgan, and Carolyn Will.

With the pandemic, OSS and our team are taking extra care to stay safe. The taco lunch fixings were prepared ahead of time and served from behind a plexiglass shield, and social interactions with the students during the meal were not allowed.

SIENA FRANCIS HOUSE

Siena Francis continues to serve the homeless in Omaha thru this times with Covid-19 and Church of the Cross also continues to support them. Volunteers assisted in serving dinners as long as volunteers were allowed to help.

We also have given 35 laundry baskets filled with cleaning supplies to assist those that have moved into the apartments of Siena Francis and those graduating from the programs and found housing. We were featured on their Facebook page.

The congregation gave many donations of jeans, under garments and socks this fall and it took two trips to deliver all the donations. The staff was very appreciative of your donations. Individuals also have donated during this time and the Mission Committee continues to deliver when needed.

Thank you to all for the dollars we give through your pledged giving and donations through out the year that assist those who are homeless at this time in life. Siena Francis is reaching out to assist this population in our city with the help of persons like YOU.


