## IN-PERSON WORSHIP RESUMES Online Worship Continues Unchanged

At its January 25 stated meeting, our Session determined to open our doors to in-person worship beginning as early as Sunday, February 7. The decision was based on the good news of the vaccines being rolled out, the recent improving numbers in Douglas County, and the confidence in our members who are ready to attend in-person worship to abide by our protocols required to gather again. Beginning on Sunday, February 7, we plan to offer one worship service at 11:10 in the sanctuary on Sundays. Children's Sunday School is not offered.

Mask-wearing will, of course, be required for those age 5 and older. Social distancing will be observed during all worship services. Hand sanitation stations will be available and should be used. Ushers will escort and dismiss folks to their pews, which won't contain any Bibles or hymnals. The offering plate will be placed in the narthex. Congregational singing will be kept to a minimum, and the service will be shorter and simpler than usual. Only the South Entrance will be used, and there will not be any mingling in the Narthex before or after the service. (As the Building Campaign has reminded us – we need a bigger gathering space - it's just impossible to keep 6 feet apart!)

These are the same protocols established by the Session when in-person briefly resumed in the fall, only to be suspended when the Douglas County numbers rose to the "Severe" level on October 17. However, in January these numbers finally fell below the Severe level, and have continued that way for three consecutive weeks. Related to this decision, the Session has also allowed for small group gatherings to resume in the building, beginning February 1. All groups must be approved and scheduled by the church staff. Strict protocols for meetings, including masks and distancing, are to be followed, and each group is tasked with cleaning their meeting area afterwards. The small groups which met in the building from March to October are familiar with these measures. Partly due to their excellent compliance, the Session is happy to extend this opportunity to these groups again.

This February re-opening is in no sense a "Grand Opening!" It is not an invitation for all to gather again. That day is not yet here. We do not expect everyone to join together in the sanctuary, nor should they. While this re-opening our building and sanctuary is certainly a welcome step to many, it does not mean that we are out of danger yet. The pandemic is far from over, although there is now a light at the end of the tunnel - but it's still a long tunnel. It will take a long time for everyone to get the vaccine. Patience and vigilance are still required of all of us.

Our on-line worship will continue unchanged – we provide a new pre-recorded service which is available every Sunday morning. Thank you for your faithful attendance, which our statistics prove, continues strong. Most members will continue to "find us online" as we've been doing since last March.

Either way, in-person or online, continue to walk with the Lord. This horrible pandemic tests us every day. Continue to plug into the activities offered. God is faithful. Keep strong in the Lord!

#### **SINGING (AND PLAYING) GOD'S PRAISES DURING THE PANDEMIC**

Last March, amid peak preparation of music for Palm Sunday and Easter, I had the sad and difficult task of cancelling all rehearsals and other gatherings of Alleluia Singers, Chamber Singers, the Carillon Choir, and Trinity Brass. The pandemic had just begun, and we were trying to figure out how to navigate through the shock of our daily routines grinding to a sudden halt.

Back then, I had great hope that our loss of singing and playing together would be limited to a month or two. Surely, I thought, by summer we can all be back together. As the summer months dragged on, I extended that hope into the fall and thought we could pick up where we left off.

When fall came, my hope for any kind of normal music schedule was dwindling along with the falling and decaying leaves and the shortening daylight hours. I didn't want to accept a world without the act of corporate singing or playing. What to do?

It turns out that even though we can't (and shouldn't) squeeze sixty singers into a room for a 90-minute rehearsal, there are other ways to make music together. For the past few months, I've had small ensembles meeting periodically in Fellowship Hall or in the Sanctuary where there is plenty of room to spread out. We wear masks and sing for shorter periods of time. We've sung hymns and carols outdoors. We made a virtual choir video for the Christmas Eve service, and have another project planned for February. We've had vocal and instrumental ensembles and soloists record music for online worship services. In short, there has been no lack of singing and playing God's praises!

Now, as we look ahead to springtime, with the development and administering of vaccines, there is a light at the end of the tunnel that glows a bit brighter each day. We will slowly assemble everyone and get back to our very busy schedules. We will diligently rehearse and work towards singing and playing to the very best of our abilities.

There is hope!

*Lent in Plain Sight* by Jill Duffield

## The View from My Office – FEBRUARY 2021

Generally, I publish this article monthly. It has been eleven months since I last published an article for Cross Currents. With other members of the staff at Church of the Cross, I've been busy looking for solutions, ideas, and ways to keep our church's membership alive. I took on the role of recording every portion of the worship service; never were we all in the sanctuary at once. One day I may have recorded that week's music and another day prayers and confessions, and yet another day a welcome, sermon, and benediction. In addition, I also started recording services for Kirk Ryckman and the Anderson Grove Presbyterian Church. I am the lucky one, I have had my own personal worship services each week. And I am thrilled with the quality of our online presence and how many of you are faithfully attending church each week.



Your generosity did not stop with your pledged dollars in 2020. During 2019, the Thanksgiving Offering generated \$1,546.17 and in 2020, the Thanksgiving Offering generated \$5,675.00. In 2019, the Christmas Offering generated \$2,842.58 and in 2020 the Christmas Offering generated \$5,675.00. Many members also give to the Heartland Hope Food Bank each month with your generous food and hygiene donations. Many other members give by writing a check regularly for Heartland Hope Food Bank through the church. During 2019 the individual gifts were \$3,554.54 and in 2020 the individual gifts were \$13,606.00. Our church's membership clearly understands our need to support our local communities and PC USA. Thank you.

At the end of December, I had the privilege of moving some funds into our savings account to help defray a future expense. Some of these are done each year like our National Youth Presbyterian Events. We set aside money for a couple of years and our youth attend the National Triennium every three years. The same is true for the blacktop parking lot maintenance. This blacktop is sealed, and parking spaces repainted every two years. Planning ahead like this helps our cash flow and keeps our church financially strong.

Another thrill for me is your faithful commitment to not only our church but our community and the world. Last spring when the pandemic began, who would have thought we would still be wearing masks, social distancing, and planning our errands to limit our exposure in public places. Many of us, including Anna and myself have contracted the disease. What I have learned is that everyone's symptoms are different and unique. We thank you for your many prayers, your unending support of our family, and your continued love for us.

I would encourage you to remember our partner church in Gnozdovo, Russia. Recently, many members have also been suffering from mild to severe symptoms from Covid-19. Including Pastor Leonid and his wife Elena. Each of them had extended stays in a hospital and are at home recovering.

Thank you for your support during this past year.

Just drop your receipts off in either the Hy-Vee or Family Fare boxes at the church, and the Mission committee will take care of the rest. The condition of your receipts makes a **BIG** difference as to whether they can successfully be used to collect funds. Please make sure your receipts meet the following criteria before dropping them off.

- Are as flat/unwrinkled as possible
- Have minimal wrinkles or bends
- Are clipped together in long lengths with as few folds as possible
- Are not taped or stapled to other receipts

## CREATIVITY & HARD WORK MAKE A MERRY HHM CHRISTMAS

2020 challenged everyone to think and work in new ways. Heartland Hope Mission (HHM) met that challenge with ingenuity and hard work to plan and successfully execute their annual Christmas celebration. They renamed the event from “Christmas in South Omaha” to a “Hope Filled Christmas.” They also used technology to make gift collection and distribution as virtual as possible to reduce exposure to COVID-19 for their clients and supporters. Supporters could donate gifts in person, make online contributions, buy gifts online through Amazon, or adopt a family.

50% of the families who applied were ‘adopted’ through the Adopt-a-Family option. The other 50% were provided with gifts for their children through donated funds, gift drives, and the online Amazon shopping option. Each child received two gifts and a needed item, 3 stocking stuffers, and a roll of wrapping paper.

In previous years, PCOC has participated in the HHM gift drive with our Giving Tree and onsite gift collection. To reduce the COVID risks for our congregation, the Mission Committee decided to promote online shopping through Amazon and online contributions instead of our traditional Giving Tree. A total of 363 toys were received through Amazon, but HHM was not able to isolate how many of those were from PCOC. HHM created a dedicated donation page for our church, with a goal of \$1000. PCOC members donated \$1,017 in online contributions!

Thank you for supporting this annual event and helping children in our local area who wouldn’t have otherwise had gifts this Christmas.
