A NEW SEASON AT CHURCH

Here is a snippet from a recent article from the Presbyterian Foundation which I believe also describes us here at PCOC:

"As we gradually emerge from the restrictions imposed by the pandemic, we are all searching for who God is calling us to be and what God is urging us to do in a new season as the church. That search necessarily involves experimentation, change, risk, energy, intelligence, and imagination..."

While we don't know exactly when "things will get back to normal," we can sense that we're cautiously moving in the right direction. As the vaccines roll out, more activities are resuming at church. Folks are slowly returning to worship in the sanctuary and in-person activities in our building. Yes, we are entering into a new season as a church.

We don't know just yet what worship will look like this summer. We may need to keep offering two worship services so we can remain socially distanced, but it's too early to tell.

Your Session is making plans for summer worship that include meeting outside several times throughout the summer—on June 6, July 11, and August 22.

No matter how, when, or where we meet for worship, the Congregational Life Committee is making plans to provide Coffee and Doughnut Holes each Sunday on the patio this summer, beginning Memorial Day weekend.

The Session has also authorized what we are calling "Phase 2" of the Capital Campaign – the push to achieve the remaining pledges needed to complete our goal. You will be hearing about upcoming activities and programs highlighting our envisioned building expansion.

Our Mission Committee is again planning for visiting volunteer PDA work groups to stay with us this summer, as they return to work in flood relief in the King Lake area.

Paula Allen's Tai Chi classes have resumed.

Betty Baddley's Music and Movement classes have resumed, on a limited basis.

Active Minds will resume meeting in May. (Details on page 7)

Kristi Treu is actively recruiting high school singers to gather again this summer for our summer Youth Choir Festival. An outdoor Vesper Concert featuring the Offutt Brass is scheduled for June.

Our Junior High and Senior High summer mission trips are scheduled, and kids are signing up with Heather Berry.

A Young Adult mission trip is also being planned by Christine Dempsey.

VBS plans are underway, possibly being planned for outside this summer.

While we don't know today just exactly how all these events will transpire, we are all excited to at least be able to cautiously make plans. But remember what's required of all of us - "experimentation, change, risk, energy, intelligence, and imagination."

No, we're not back to normal yet, but as spring and summer enfold, I think we'll be up to the task.

As followers of our risen Lord, let's look to the future with confidence!


Register Now for the 6th Annual Summer Youth Choir Festival June 21-27



UPDATE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

WOW! What a year we have been through. Who could have dreamed up the pandemic, and how it would affect our lives?

And yet, in spite of COVID-19, our campaign to raise funds for our building expansion and improvements is alive and well.

Church of the Cross is grateful beyond measure for each dollar that is pledged and given toward creating an even more welcoming and inviting front door to our worship area.

As a church, we are ready to move on to Phase II as we strategize and finalize the fundraising efforts for the capital campaign. To date \$2,229,000 has been pledged. And more than \$1,164,300 has been given

and is now on deposit at our bank.



Remember, our new space is envisioned to become a major hub for our church – a place for gathering before and after worship services, weddings, and funerals, for receptions, greeting new members, and providing space for adult education.

OTHER INFORMATION

In this pandemic year, the church has noticed the generosity of our members. In 2019 the Thanksgiving and Christmas offerings were \$1,546 and \$2,842, respectively, while in 2020 these offerings were \$5,675 and \$5,301. Then, in 2020, the One Great Hour of Sharing offering was \$3,890. So far in 2021, we have given \$5,080, and more may yet be given.
