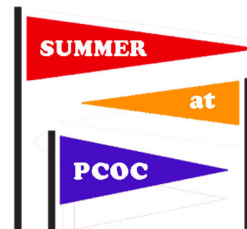
Join us to celebrate our church family and the capital campaign!

Starting to Make Plans Again

With the recent news from the Douglas County Health Department that the COVID-19 risk levels are at their lowest level in over a year, your PCOC Session has voted to adjust our masking and social distancing policies. Did you think this day would never come?

For those fully vaccinated, masks and social distancing are no longer required. If you have not been fully vaccinated, we ask that you continue to wear a mask when we are indoors. See page 11 for more details.

While things are not yet completely back to normal, we're hopeful for continued progress as summer unfolds. Our nation, our city, and our county are now in a much better place, and it's encouraging to see many of our cherished local activities beginning to be scheduled again.

As you can tell in this Cross Currents, church life is beginning to pick up, as well. In-person worship attendance is increasing, with the joy of seeing new folks returning each Sunday. Summer activities are once again on the schedule – we finally have events to announce!

Each person now has the task of determining when the time is right for them to return to socializing again. We are not all at the same place yet. Some of our folks were ready to rejoin church activities when we re-opened the sanctuary on February 7, and others are still not ready to venture back. Many are so ready to ditch their masks, others are more hesitant. The fact of nearly 600,000 American lives lost has affected us all.

As summer unfolds, we need to continue to exercise patience and grace to each other. Different families are in different situations. We have all been under stress for so long – let us finish this race strong, with resolve not to quit, feeling united in our common faith and support of one another.

I want to express my thanks to all our members and guests who have adhered to our masking policies throughout the pandemic. From when we returned to in-person worship 16 weeks ago to now, every person coming to church has dutifully worn their mask and tried their best to social distance

(although I have observed that it is practically impossible for good Presbyterians to keep six feet apart while greeting each other or catching up with long-lost friends as we gather again!).

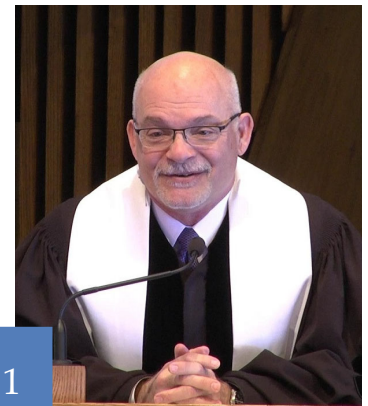

Living in the Light

Throughout the book of John, we learn about living in the light as disciples of Christ. While we think about our life as followers of Christ, we often forget about the communal call of our discipleship and instead think about our actions and feelings in terms of the individual. Yet, in John’s first letter we are reminded that if we walk in the light then we have “fellowship with one another.” (1 John 1:7) In other words, a life in Jesus is by definition a life where we are connected to one another.

Despite the interconnection between Christ and his disciples, many of us strike out on our own looking for faith from some kind of inner flame. When we do this, we overlook our relationships to one another, our call to be part of the body of Christ and our mutual love and care for each other. To truly follow Christ, it is our responsibility to seek out relationships with one another, and this means active participation in the church including worship, mission work, and fellowship.

As we all know, it has been difficult to foster community during the COVID-19 pandemic, but the experience has reminded us of the importance of our relationships. As we slowly emerge from COVID-19, I encourage you to seek out one another. This is the time to try something new in the church: join a committee, try a fellowship group, participate in a mission project, or, if you are really bold, join the youth in a game of Bald Eagle.

While we are picking up our old activities, I would like to introduce you to a new ministry aimed at young adults. So far, this group is mostly for millennials and Gen-Zs. We are working on a mini-summer mission trip from June 24-27 where we will launch from Camp Calvin Crest and work on mission projects in the area. Please come join us and help create the bonds on Christ as we become the hands and feet of Christ himself. This will be a way to build relationships with another as Christ has called us. Bring your lawn chairs. Picnics are welcome! The concert will be moved indoors if it rains.

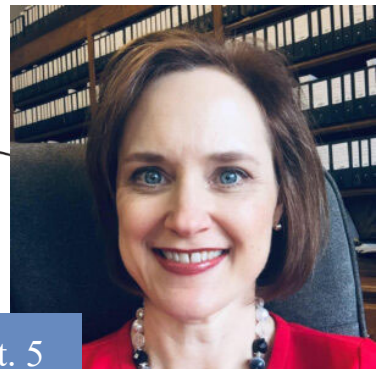

What the Pandemic Taught Me About Church

The biggest takeaway in pandemic learning for me is that the church can adapt and change quickly. That is not the usual Presbyterian pattern or tradition.

Last year, as the pandemic began and worshipping at Church of the Cross was closed down, we were ready to pre-record our worship in separate recordings and bring a new face to online worship. Now a year later, it is a part of our weekly rhythm.

In fact, our online worship has reached new people and as in-person worship is again establishing itself, we will continue our online presence for the foreseeable future.

Do not get me wrong, I enjoy seeing people in the pews again, but having spent a year recording online worship for our church has taught me a bit about how God can stretch us. I agree with our Presbyterian way of making decisions. That we use votes and majorities and that we take the time to listen to voices that are not our own.

I am confident in our Session to lead and make decisions for our church so that we remain a strong presence in our community.

My assessment is that sometimes we let the process slow us down. Remember that God is always calling us to be the church in the here and now; and that the Holy Spirit is always moving and equipping us with the gifts needed to meet these needs.

Many pandemic activities will come to an end — activities like Sunday morning online coffee hour, committee meetings on Zoom, and watching worship at home in our slippers. For some of us, a year ago it was a big change getting used to these activities that now seem to be a normal part of our lives.

I understand that technology has played a role helping keep our church to stay operational and engage with members. As one of our church leaders, I also understand that we will need to prepare members

for recovery from the pandemic as we focus on in-person worship and summer activities.

I hope we continue to live into answering the call to be Christians without dragging our feet quite so much.

Camp Calvin Crest is a Presbyterian camp southwest of Fremont that serves thousands of youth and adults every year by providing quality Christian programs. Before the camp opens for the season, they want a picnic shelter built next to the swimming pool and accessible from the dining hall. On Friday, May 7, our PCOC volunteers began the work of installing the long posts to support this shelter. Our "Spirit of Mission" volunteers were Mike Howland, Matt Will, Frank McMullen, and Jon Boomgaarden (notice them decked out in their PCOC Mission t-shirts).



The group started the day with donuts and coffee, and then they got organized and busy installing the 14 and 18 foot posts. They were assisted by Bob Tokorny, the camp maintenance man, who had prepared sixteen holes 18" wide x 42" deep with a power auger before the group arrived. He had the posts, supplies, and tools ready to go for the volunteers, too. At midday, the group enjoyed a sack lunch outside the dining hall. By the end of the day, our small but mighty group had installed 10 posts. The camp executive director, Craig Huffman, really appreciated PCOC's service to the camp.

SHF Mission Trip to Arkansas

On June 13, our senior high youth group will head to Ferncliff Camp near Little Rock, Arkansas. Ferncliff is a unique camp destination that is unlike any others we've recently visited. The camp is home to a Disaster Assistance Center, which provides support to both Church World Service (CWS) and Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA). Our group will be helping with PDA hygiene kit receiving and sorting.



Ferncliff is also home to a Nature School and offers day and overnight camps where kids can grow their faith. The SHF group will be building a new garden fence, laying crushed stone pathways, and building a new goat area for Ferncliff Farm. The youth will also design, build, paint, and name a new slingshot range for the campers.

Outside of working, the youth will tour the Central High School historic site. They will take a guided tour with a park ranger and learn about the Little Rock Nine.

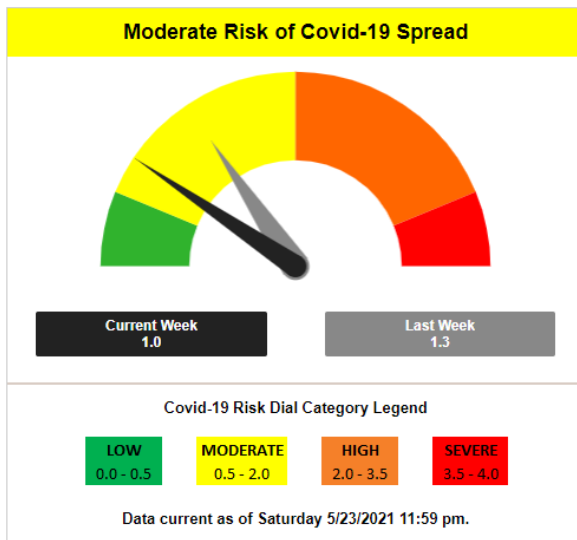

COVID-19 challenged us to find new ways to worship, learn, and join in fellowship. As a church community, we participated in worship from our homes and connected through Zoom and outdoors for other church life. We've gradually resumed more activities at the church with precautions in place, and we've watched with hope as the vaccines became available and our local COVID infection rates began to drop. Douglas County is now at the lowest risk of COVID-19 spread since this time last year.

The PCOC Safety Committee has monitored the developments and studied the recommendations from the CDC for those who are fully vaccinated. As a result, the Session met on Monday, May 24 to review and approve the following changes to our safety protocols effective immediately.

Anyone who is fully vaccinated may participate in all activities at the church without a mask and without social distancing.

Some people may feel more comfortable continuing to wear a mask at church or may have a medical need to do so, even when fully vaccinated. Please be considerate and understand that wearing a mask is for safety.

For anyone who is not vaccinated (ages 2 and above), we ask that you continue to wear a mask and follow social distancing measures while inside the church. Doing so will protect others in our church community who are not vaccinated and those who are vaccinated but may have a lessened immune response.

If you or a family member are not feeling well, you should stay home from church to be safe.

Beginning on Sunday, May 30, you will notice the following changes to worship in the sanctuary.

- All pews will be available for seating during worship.
- The center aisle will be used for traffic flow.
- Hymnals and Bibles will be placed in the pew racks for use.

Outdoor events will be mask-optional for all attendees.

- Three outdoor worship services and all-church events are planned for June 6, July 11, and August 22.
- A Vesper Concert will be held on the East Lawn June 13 at 3 p.m.
- VBS will be an outdoor event July 13-15.

Coffee fellowship will resume outdoors on May 30 and then move into Fellowship Hall starting on June 13.

All groups using our facility including Youth Choir Festival participants and PDA mission guests staying at Church of the Cross this summer will follow these same protocols. All groups are asked to track their own group participants for their event.

Contact tracing of the COVID-19 virus remains a concern. As a result, the following precautions will remain in place.

- Passing of the sign-in books, offering plates, and communion trays will not resume at this time.
- Photos will be taken at each worship service, so we can identify who was in attendance.
- When the church office becomes aware of a person who has attended an event that develops COVID-19, the church will notify the congregation via email. Members or guests will be encouraged to determine if they were in attendance for the event and to self-monitor for symptoms.

We are excited to see our church life and activities resume. The Safety Committee will continue to follow local developments and provide guidance consistent with the CDC recommendations as we move forward.
