



City of Omaha COVID-19 Prevention Order

In accordance with last Wednesday's COVID-19 Prevention Order issued by the City Health Director, our church's Safety Committee urges us to comply with this mandate requiring the wearing of masks in all premises that are open to the general public, including churches. A Big Thank You from the Mission Committee

COVID Safety Update

COVID cases are on the rise in Omaha, so let's work together to keep our congregation safe! Please do your part. If you or a family member are not feeling well, please stay home from church. While at church, please follow our safety protocols.

Our Safety Committee met on Wednesday, offering this summary:

"The City Health Director for the City of Omaha has issued an Order instituting a mask mandate, effective January 12, 2022, and continuing for four weeks with the possibility of being extended. The full text of the Order can be found on the website of the Douglas County Health Department (douglascountyhealth.com). The Order states that all those ages five (5) and older must wear a mask over their mouth and nose unless they are able to maintain six feet of separation at all times from anyone who is not a member of their household. The Church expects those attending worship in person to comply with the terms of the Order. In addition, the Church requires anyone participating in youth or adult education or other activities inside the church to wear a mask at all times during the activity."

Thus, our safety protocols have changed, and we expect those attending worship and activities in person to comply with the terms of the City Order by doing the following:

- Wear a mask in the hallways, in the Narthex, and while entering and exiting the Sanctuary until you are seated. These are situations where 6 feet of distance cannot be guaranteed at all times.
- When choosing your seat in the Sanctuary, observe social distancing guidelines and sit at least 6 feet away from others who are not part of your household. If you are unable to maintain 6 feet of distance, keep your mask on.

While masks are not required if you can maintain the conditions above, masks are still recommended to protect your health and the health of those around you.

And remember, for anyone participating in youth or adult education/activities inside the church, wear a mask at all times during the activity.
