# **Senior High Mission Trip**

Our SHF group had a productive first week of June serving Clearwater Forest Presbyterian Camp in Deerwood, Minnesota. We left bright and early on Sunday morning and returned in the late afternoon on Saturday. Our group consisted of 12 youth and 4 adults, which we fit into two passenger vans and a cargo van. We were lucky to be housed in a beautiful lodge right on the lake. We enjoyed cooling off in the lake, and using pedal boats, water bikes, canoes and kayaks. A surprise to everyone was the size of the mosquitoes in Minnesota – they were huge! And there were so many of them! We also had fun checking ourselves for ticks each night. We all worked very hard while at camp.



Here is a list of what we accomplished: \*Disassembled, rebuilt, routed edges, and stained 18, 10-foot wooden benches

\*Scraped and stained the outdoor chapel floor that is approximately 15 feet square

\*Spread new mulch around the newly constructed benches \*Disassembled 200 feet of old wooden fencing and replaced with new fencing \*Found and moved 7,000 pounds of rocks/ boulders to line their sidewalks



\*Cleared fallen trees and branches around the lodge, dining hall, and lakefront

\*Fastened down a new surface for a dock to reduce tripping

\*Filled in leveled a ditch approximately 600 feet long

\*Scraped and stained 7 picnic tables

\*Scraped, prepped, and stained trim on a large bathhouse

\*Scraped and stained hanging benches from the circle swing that was constructed by our SHF group back in 2016

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#### **Junior High Mission Trip**

Bright and early on a Friday morning in June, our JHF group departed for our 3-day mission trip to Kansas City. Our group consisted of 14 youth and 5 adults. We were



hosted by Pine Ridge Presbyterian Church in Kansas City, Missouri. They had a lovely stand-alone house that we were lucky enough to sleep in. We even met up with their youth group one evening for fun and games.

While in Kansas City, we served at three amazing organizations.

On Friday morning, we prepped, served, and cleaned up lunch for the homeless community at Nourish KC. We worked non-stop for 4 hours and served 1,335 meals!



Saturday morning we served at Uplift, an organization that serves the homeless community. In the evenings, they take vans out into the community and hand out food, clothing, medicine, and pretty much whatever they need. We worked in their warehouse, sorting all types of donations, filling water jugs, filling small bags of cat and dog food, and loving on their free roaming dog ambassador, Dosha. Saturday afternoon we served at Harvesters, the food bank that serves several counties in Kansas and

Missouri. We worked on sorting and bagging carrots. It was a fast and furious two hours! Saturday evening we were ready for some fun, so we went bowling.





On Sunday morning, we attended worship and then spent some time at Worlds of Fun. We headed home after that.

### **Patriotic Concert on July 7**


A short program of patriotic music will follow the worship service on Sunday morning, July 7. Music will be presented by brass, organ, and singers. You'll hear many of your
