Mission Opportunity – As the summer heat intensifies, the Siena Francis House (a local mission partner), provides one of several "cooling centers" in Omaha to help lower the risk of heat-related illnesses & deaths. The nonprofit organization, which serves Omaha's unhoused population, provides an airconditioned space that can fit up to 70 people. Caseworkers from Siena Francis provide bottled water, sunscreen, lip balm and lunch to any person without housing. This is a short list of the most needed items: Sunscreen, Chapstick, Aloe Vera Gelor any type of sunburn relief cream/gel, Hats - sun hats, baseball hats, Hydration packs with electrolytes - the powder you can mix with water is preferred, and bottled water. Please consider donating these items this week when you are at church or Sunday morning when you attend worship. There will be bins with "Cooling Center Donations" outside the church office.
