

COMMISSIONING OF MISSION TEAM TO LITHUANIA (11:10)

Anne Wattles, Becky Zieman, and Marshall Zieman will form part of a group of 13 PCUSA participants and leaders who have prepared for months to explore the painful and lingering legacies of war in the small Baltic country of Lithuania. This travel seminar will move from Vilnius to Klaipeda learning about the country's history from the Nazi and Soviet occupations to today's Ukrainian refugee crisis. The group will learn about efforts to help survivors, descendants and communities open up, confront, heal and learn from war-time experiences. The time spent at LCC International University in Klaipeda will include meeting with students from across the former Soviet Union (including Ukraine, Belarus and Russia) and war affected countries in the Middle East and Africa, including participation in the university's Center for Dialogue and Conflict Transformation, learning about their peace and reconciliation work in and beyond Lithuania.
