



Silent Prayers of Confession and Petition



OWS, formed in 2022, strives to serve migrants fleeing violence and persecution in their home countries by providing safety, hospitality, hope and assistance with establishing new lives in the United States. Learn more about their work and ways they collaborate with local churches, service providers, and volunteers, in order to fulfill its mission of providing compassionate care to immigrants.

Connecting with the Center for Immigrant and Refugee Advancement (CIRA) – May 4

CIRA's history is embedded in the 1997 founding of the Southern Sudan Community Associations. This led to Omaha having one of the largest Sudanese communities in the country. A 2022 merger between two refugee resettlement organizations created the CIRA. Erik Omar will summarize the array of services they now provide including legal, resettlement and social services in a growing number of locations spanning from Council Bluffs to Scottsbluff. He also has important information to share with us about the changes underway in our country and the challenges faced within their agency and the immigrant community.
